FRESHMEN

The class of 2021 will be participating in the eighth annual religious forum. World religions is a major cornerstone of the freshman curriculum in Social Studies and students will use this day to visit houses of religious worship and ask community members questions about these religions. This experience affords students the opportunity to see different houses of worship and ask questions about these places. Students will preference which houses of worship to visit. Students will need to bring a brown bag lunch as they will be out of the building all day and will not be stopping to buy lunch. A permission slip has been distributed in your child's freshman Social Studies class. Any student not given permission to attend the Religious Forum will not be penalized in any way; students not attending the Religious Forum will have an alternative assignment to complete.

SOPHOMORES

The class of 2020 will be participating in college visits on April 10th. Sophomores received their [permission slip](#) in English class last week and have been asked to have it signed and turned in by March 16th. If students do not wish to attend a visit, they are still expected to be in school and an alternative assignment will be provided. English teachers will be paired with a counselor who will be the lead chaperone at each school. Students will be assigned to a college with their entire English class and learn their destination the morning of April 10th. Students are encouraged to bring a sack lunch or \$15 for a lunch. Lunch options will be coordinated by chaperones on day of the trip. English teachers we will receive additional information regarding itineraries by April 4th. Itineraries will include specific departure times and location that need to be directly communicated with students prior to the day of the trip. Schools our students will be visiting are: Loyola University, University of Illinois-Chicago, University Wisconsin Whitewater, University Wisconsin Madison, and/or Carroll University.

JUNIORS

The Class of 2019 will be taking the SAT on April 10 which is an Illinois state requirement. Accepted by all U.S. colleges, the SAT is an opportunity for students to show colleges that they have what it takes to succeed academically on campus. The SAT is made up of separate timed tests in reading, writing and language, math without a calculator, math with a calculator, and an essay response.

Students will not be admitted after testing has begun. Plan to be at school by 7:20 am.

A small number of calculators will be available for check out on the day of testing.

This SAT test will include the supplemental essay section.

Students are required to bring the following to SAT testing: Their school ID or other picture ID; at least two #2 pencils and erasers; and an approved calculator.
