Dear Parent,

In 2005, Max Schewitz died without warning from a hidden heart condition. He was just 20. Now, HeartSmart EKG helps find at-risk young adults so they can seek treatment and not share Max's fate.

Screening will be offered on WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 9th to all ANTIOCH COMMUNITY HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS – ONE DAY ONLY.

- Testing includes an EKG for all participants.
- Students selected by the cardiologist will also receive an echocardiogram on test day **at no cost.**
- Only students with permission through the online registration will be tested.
- Testing costs \$15 per student IF REGISTERED BY 9/24/2019. Testing costs \$20 per student if REGISTERED AFTER 9/24/2019. Approved free & reduced lunch students are tested at no charge.
- Please register your student at: www.HeartSmartEKG.org. **Because the heart changes over time, an EKG is recommended every 2 years, so previously tested students should register for testing.**

HeartSmart EKG has provided almost 90,000 EKGs to area students.

- Testing is conducted during students' PE, Health or Study Halls in private booths.
- Every effort is made to respect privacy and modesty. Testing takes place in individual booths. Males are tested separately from females and no one removes their shirt for EKG testing.
- Cardiologist Eli Lavie, MD oversees all aspects of testing and interpretation.
- Results are confidential and are shared only with parents within 2 weeks after testing.
- Copies of the actual test are given to parents who register by the early deadline of Tuesday, 9/24/2019. Parents requesting an optional copy of the actual test after 9/24/2019 incur a \$10 handling fee.
