School

Antioch Community High School, a four-year comprehensive school, was established in 1915. Fully accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education, Antioch Community High School serves the Northwestern Lake County community of Antioch. In a recent report, Antioch Community High School was distinguished for representing the ninth largest positive trend out of 136 Chicago suburban high schools over a ten-year span.

The school day consists of eight class periods with an option for juniors and seniors to take a zero hour class. Students are able to take up to eight 50-minute classes per semester. The ACHS school year is divided into two semesters. Semester 1: August 19, 2015 – December 18, 2015 and Semester 2: January 4, 2016 – May 25, 2016.

Total enrollment for the 2015-16 school year is 1,353 with students in grades 9-12.

Community

Antioch Community High School proudly serves the Village of Antioch. Our school and surrounding community is exceptionally supportive of all academic, athletic, and extracurricular endeavors.

ACHS is located approximately 55 miles north of Chicago in Lake County and is within a 30 minute drive from the following high schools: Lakes, Carmel, Grayslake Central, Grayslake North, Lake Forest, Libertyville, Mundelein, Warren, and Wauconda.

Directions to our school from the Chicago area: Travel I-94 West toward Milwaukee, Exit on IL-173 (Rosecrans Rd.). Travel West on IL-173 to Main St. (Route 83), the school is located on the Northeast corner of Route 173 and Main St. (Route 83).

Faculty and Staff

The faculty consists of 100 full-time certified staff with four full time counselors. The student/teacher ratio is 18:1. In 2014, District 117 was proud to have 65.5% of all faculty members hold a master's degree or higher, and the average faculty member's years of experience was 11.6.

Curriculum

Antioch Community High School offers a wide variety of courses in order to challenge each student to achieve his/her potential. Over 150 courses are offered, some on different levels of content, depth, and breadth.

Cum Laude

Beginning with the graduating class of 2015, District 117 students have the opportunity to graduate Cum Laude. Students earning this distinction are meeting the criteria of Scholarship (at least 26 credits), Character (no suspensions), Community Volunteerism (at least 40 hours), Responsibility (minimum attendance rate of 95%), Excellence (at least 3 capstone classes), and Pride (at least 4 extracurricular activities).
